Course Overview

Bringing <u>Your</u> Literature to Life is an opportunity for you to brainstorm with the instructor to develop concrete activities for the reading content you teach. The instructor is willing to collaborate with you to design activities for your curriculum that puts the student in the *author's* place, or in the *main character's* place, bringing literature to life!

Course Objectives:

The teacher will:

- Develop interactive activities for specific literature selections.
- Collect materials needed for interactive activities (particularly model building and art projects).
- Locate specific books needed for each literature exploration.
- Provide opportunities (time and space) for students to engage in concrete explorations.
- Lead students in open-ended brainstorming sessions.

B2 Literature Activities for Students

Two interactive activities are required for each literature selection.
